Required documentation includes one of the following:

- <u>Certificate of Completion:</u> Student name, date of completion, and training provider information (seal, logo, signature, web URL, etc.).
- <u>License:</u> Student name, date of completion, training provider information (seal, logo, signature, web URL, etc.).
- <u>Transcript:</u> Student name, the title of course(s), date(s) of completion, amount of time taken to complete the course(s), and training provider information (seal, logo, signature, web URL, etc.).
- <u>Copy of Exam Report:</u> Student name, date of completion, training provider information (seal, logo, signature, websiteURL, etc.).
