Undergraduate Admissions Requirements

- Must have graduated from a regionally or nationally accredited high school, passed a high school level proficiency test, or have documented home school completion (please see Basis for Admissions policy for more information about home school documentation).
- Applicants who have prior College Level credits must have a transfer GPA of 2.0 from institutional accreditor approved by the US Department of Education.
- Applicants who have prior College Level credits with a transfer GPA below 2.0 may be admitted under Probationary Admission.

Undergraduate General Education (GE) Requirements

The General Education sequence is comprised of 48 semester credit hours (16 courses) aligned with five general education areas of study. Students may fulfill the required 48 credit hours by either; transferring course credits from other accredited institutions, submitting evidence of ACE approved comparable coursework or by completing NU General Education courses.
